

Everything on board is designed to create an atmosphere with a truly unique feel, which is both sophisticated and relaxing. PONANT EXPLORERS

These two ships have been specifically designed to offer passengers the very best experience during our Expedition Cruises, which pay tribute to the great French explorers who set off in search of new lands, taking guests in their footsteps.

In line with our philosophy, each of our ships combines cosiness, an elegant design, state-of-the-art equipment and respect for the environment.

Our fleet of 6 PONANT EXPLORERS also boast a multi-sensory underwater lounge, Blue Eye, a world first. Located in the ship's hull, under the waterline, this underwater space immerses guests in the sights and sounds of an underwater world teeming with flora and fauna.









PONANT was created by sailors with a deep connection to the sea and eager to share their passion. For more than 30 years, we have been taking our passengers to remote corners of the Earth and are very aware of our responsibility to protect the ecosystems we visit.

As such, we work day in day out to protect and respect the environment. Here are some of the things we do to achieve this.

A responsible and award-winning approach



For many years now, PONANT has actively supported the Arctic Circle, an organisation which promotes the protection of the polar environments.



PONANT received the Blue Charter Trophy from the French Shipowners' Association in recognition of its exemplary work in economic and social development, as well as environmental protection.

Constantly striving to look after the environment

From the design of our ships to landings on shore, everything has been carefully thought out so as to reduce our impact on the environment.

Our entire fleet of ships are considered 'Clean Ships' by Bureau Veritas.

There is no trail of pollution behind our ships as PONANT does not use heavy fuel oil (HFO), but instead low-sulphur marine gas oil (LS-MGO). We also sail at low speeds to keep fuel consumption to a minimum and offset our entire carbon footprint, meaning our ships are carbon neutral.

Our expedition fleet is of most modern in the world, meaning state-of-the-art equipment for sorting and recycling waste.

On board, non-recyclable plastic has been cut to a bare minimum with biodegradable straws and cups, laundry bags made from cloth, etc. having been introduced.

Grey water (bath, shower, kitchen, laundry) is systematically recycled and reused to wash the outside decks.

PONANT ships – designed with technology in mind



Sonar system to detect underwater objects, thus avoiding any risk of colliding with icebergs or reefs.



Refrigerant gas (R407C) used for air conditioning and refrigeration units. This has absolutely no impact on the ozone layer and a very small impact in terms of global warming.



Energy-saving lighting system with low levels of heat dissipation (LEDs, fibre-optic lighting).



Dynamic positioning system, allowing the ship's position to be maintained when necessary without having to lower its anchor, thus reducing our impact on the sea bed.



State-of-the-art generators featuring a built-in electronic control system in order to increase their efficiency.



Tin-free anti-fouling paint in order to protect the marine ecosystems as much as possible.



Equipment which provides real-time information on consumption to ensure maximum energy savings.

Zero impact landings on shore

As one of the world's leading operators in expeditions to remote parts of the planet, PONANT has decided to follow a strict protocol for all landings at new locations. This pioneering approach, which involves a dedicated team, has one goal - to ensure we have absolutely no impact whatsoever on the ecosystems we visit on land, and to protect the local fauna, flora and inhabitants.

All our passengers and crew members follow a code of conduct which has been carefully designed based on our research and experience, and is specific for the Arctic. On board, you will see for yourself the work carried out by our crew, day in day out, to keep our impact on the environment to a minimum. Examples include turning off lights when they are not needed and refraining from making announcements on deck. Also, you will be given a reusable vacuum-insulated bottle to avoid using plastic bottles.

Lastly and most importantly, we are well aware of the fact that upon returning home from a trip to the Arctic, our passengers become ambassadors for the region. That is why, during our Expedition Cruises and landings on shore in inflatable Zodiac® boats, you will be accompanied by a team of naturalist guides, who will provide information on the places you visit, as well as giving on-board talks.

When he is not on a PONANT expedition, he can be found on research and habitat conservation missions, as well as writing articles and books.

After spending a large part of his career as a researcher, Alain decided to pursue his passion for the polar regions and birds full time. He works at the International Polar Foundation, where he promotes the public understanding of science, and has taken part in two expeditions in Antarctica – one involving spending two months in a tent on an ice cap, and another during which he lived on an icebreaker for a month for the first ever sighting of a total eclipse of the sun from Antarctica. He is currently a naturalist guide and speaker on board PONANT's ships.



Louis Justin

With degrees from the École des Hautes Études Commerciales business school and Melbourne Business School, Louis spent four years in Australia and New Zealand before joining us on our Expedition Cruises.

He is passionate about sharing his expertise on the history of exploration and the science which has made discoveries possible. As a speaker and expedition leader, he organises trips, creates itineraries and allows passengers to discover the natural and cultural wonders of the world.

We are honoured to be guests of these remote lands, where Mother Nature rules with ever-changing weather, ice, tides and currents. Landings at certain locations and sightings of wildlife cannot be guaranteed and vary from day to day, meaning each PONANT cruise is truly unique. Your captain and expedition leader will do everything possible to make sure your experience is as rich as possible, whilst ensuring your safety and complying with AECO guidelines.

Remote lands

The Sea of Okhotsk

Translated as the 'sea of hunters', the Sea of Okhotsk is thought to have the densest fish population anywhere in the world. Very popular amongst whale hunters from the USA in the 19th century, trips lasting up to three years were common with hunters passing Cape Horn and sailing through the Sea of Okhotsk in the hope of catching whales to subsequently sell their oil for a lucrative profit. During your cruise, you will discover a rich and diverse range of wildlife, including ribbon seals, many different species of birds, grey whales, Steller's sea eagles, brown bears, eared seals and earless seals, to name but a few examples. This remote and pristine region of the Russian Far East truly offers visitors the experience of a lifetime.

Baffin Bay

This is a place where the sea ice breaks during the short summer, of snow-swept expanses of ice battered by the polar winds, unspoilt landscapes and waters pierced by majestic icebergs. It is this far-flung and unspoilt part of the world that polar bears, humpback whales, walruses and migratory birds call home. You will have the chance to go on a range of outings on an inflatable Zodiac® boat, taking you up close with these unique creatures. Whilst sailing around Baffin Bay, lose yourself in the unique beauty of its landscapes, which includes steep cliffs, imposing fjords, glaciers and icebergs glistening in the soft sunlight.

Spitsbergen

We will sale to the 78th parallel north, where the rugged coastline of Spitsbergen, the last island before the polar region, rises out of the waters. Here, from the icy sea, passengers are treated to breathtaking panoramic views, as well as an exceptional and diverse range of wildlife. Bearded seals perched on the sea ice watching the world go by, Arctic terns flying high above and beluga whales surfacing from the water make for a truly magical spectacle. During expeditions on land, we will retrace the footsteps of explorers from bygone times, and days at sea will include unique outings in an inflatable Zodiac® boat at dawn in search of the King of the Arctic – the polar bear.

Greenland

This is a land that time forgot, surrounded by the polar wilderness, whose sheer beauty profoundly moves those who visit it. Discover the island at the end of the world, Greenland. As the ship is approaching its coastline, you will be treated to a magnificent sight – a mix of lush green, water, ice, icebergs and bright colours, bathed in radiant sunlight. Here, the inhabitants have a unique relationship with nature and the island is home to an exceptionally diverse range of wildlife, including eight species of whales, two million earless seals, walruses, polar bears and many different types of seabirds.

The Aleutian Islands

Off Alaska's south-west coast, the Aleutian Islands form an arc spanning almost 2000 kilometres between the Pacific Ocean and the Bering Sea. A natural bridge between the Kamchatka Peninsula in Russia and Alaska, they form part of the Pacific Ring of Fire. Each island is an ice-capped volcano offering breathtaking scenery made up of tundra, as well as blankets of wild flowers and lichens. The wildlife here is no less impressive and diverse with whales and killer whales being common sights. Don't forget to look up at the sky either to catch a glimpse of one of the 200 species of birds which call this archipelago home.

Iceland

A land of extremes and contrasts on the fringes of the Arctic Circle, Iceland is characterised by its unique, rugged beauty, shaped by the wind, rocks, fire and ice. Here, volcanoes, geysers, fjords and untamed expanses of wilderness come together to create something which is truly unique, magical and almost otherworldly. A mythical land of elves and seismic energy, constantly put to the test by Mother Nature, Iceland offers an awe-inspiring spectacle of colours, from the black of its obsidian to the lush green of its grass-topped cliffs. Discover the Land of Fire and Ice, which emerges majestically from the ocean.

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The Greenland of the Great Explorers

LONGYEARBYEN, SPITSBERGEN – KANGERLUSSUAQ 15 days/14 nights | From 25 June to 9 July 2020 | L'Austral











Sail your way through history on this itinerary which will take you in the footsteps of the great French explorers who first began France's great tradition of polar exploration and pushed back the frontiers in the Arctic. Jules de Blosseville, Jean-Baptiste Charcot and Paul-Émile Victor all explored the icy expanses of Greenland during three different periods in history.

Just as these great explorers did, we will begin our journey by leaving behind Spitsbergen's pristine scenery to head to Greenland's east coast. You will discover a magical world, such as Jan Mayen Island with its snow-capped peaks, Greenland's Blosseville Coast with sea ice slowly drifting along its shores, remote villages and the Inuit people living by the traditions of their ancestors.

Your cruise will then sail along the south-west coast of Greenland, a chance to take in majestic scenery, including the awe-inspiring fjords of the Prince Christian Sound and the blue-tinged icebergs of Narsaq. With a bit of luck, you will catch a glimpse of a rorqual, killer whale or earless seal to make your trip even more unforgettable.



It is in this breathtaking and remote part of the world that you will have the opportunity to visit traditional villages and meet the local Inuit people, whose hospitality and sense of humour, despite living in such inhospitable conditions, is something that will undoubtedly stay with you forever.



The year is 1897. The 20th century is about to begin and there is a feeling of optimism in the air. That is because word has spread that gold has been discovered in Canada's Klondike region, causing thousands of hopeful prospectors to flock to this remote part of the world.
