ZODIAC ADVENTURES

With 20 Zodiacs on board, *Silver Cloud* has one of the best Zodiac-to-guest ratios in the Kimberley. Weave beneath the bird life of Ashmore Reef, or cruise along the shoreline of the Hunter River, scanning for crocodiles basking on the mudflats. Often, multiple tours are scheduled for the same day, so you can explore Montgomery Reef, one of the last inshore reefs in the world, and then make a landing at Freshwater Cove in the afternoon, to view awe-inspiring Aboriginal rock art.




HIKING EXCURSIONS

Each guided hike in the Kimberley is a journey through time. Discover ancient sandstone plateaus, trace the footsteps of Indigenous ancestors, and uncover rock art galleries that whisper stories thousands of years old. With every step, feel the weight of millennia beneath your feet — where geology, culture, and wilderness converge in one of the world's great frontiers.



CULTURAL IMMERSION

The Kimberley is a land where culture and landscape are inseparable. From experiencing a traditional ochre ceremony to exploring ancient rock art that has endured through millennia, you'll feel the power of a place shaped by time. Led by our expert Expedition Team and First Nation guides, you'll have the unique opportunity to explore these ancient imprints, centuries of civilisation carved into the rugged landscape.



REMARKABLE WILDLIFE ENCOUNTERS

Our Zodiac and hiking tours provide an intimate glimpse of the Kimberley's diverse wildlife. The oceans in the region provide sanctuary to many large marine mammals, such as dolphins and the elusive dugong. Birdlife flourishes here: eagles and osprey swoop above the horizon, while huge colonies of seabirds nesting on the protected shores. On land, rock wallabies forage in the undergrowth. And ruling them all is one of the world's fearsome apex predator: the mighty saltwater crocodile.

Lecturer – Marine Biology



LEA MCQUILLAN***Expedition Leader***




MONTGOMERY REEF

Montgomery Reef rises like a mirage from the sea – revealing the world's largest inland coral reef. As the tide retreats, water cascades from the reef top in shimmering waterfalls. All around, an astonishing array of marine life and birdlife emerges. In this ever-changing seascape, nature performs a breathtaking disappearing act – one that captivates the soul and leaves you spellbound.




ASHMORE REEF

Discover the stunning Ashmore Reef, a remote mid-ocean sanctuary teeming with vibrant seabirds. As you glide across the calm waters in a Zodiac, you'll witness colonies of boobies and frigatebirds nesting along its protected shores. Keep your binoculars ready – palms and rocky outcrops are alive with the sights and sounds of vibrant birdlife, creating an unforgettable connection with this untouched paradise.



EXPRESSIVE ROCK ART

Two primary rock art styles are found in different regions of the Kimberley. The Wandjina paintings, which depict ancient spirits at the heart of Dreamtime Creation and are thought to be around 3000 to 4000 years old. The Gwion Gwion, or Bradshaw art, is much older, dating back as far as 17,000 years. Viewing these spiritual paintings gives you a chance to immerse yourself in the cultural essence of area and better understand its First Nations inhabitants.



HUNTER RIVER

The wildly beautiful Hunter River region is often explored across two excursions in a day. In the morning, Zodiacs depart to allow guests to scan for crocodiles, warming their tough hides in the early morning sunshine and eyeing the mudflats for their next meal. In the afternoon the tide is high, and Zodiacs can navigate among the mangrove forests. Make sure you bring your binoculars to get the best possible views of the vibrant bird colonies.



The raw, living energy of the Kimberley, in the northernmost reaches of mainland Australia, is palpable. You can feel it in the salt air. Smell it in the earthy scent of eucalyptus. See it in the burnt orange rock formations, geometric and mesmerising, like a jigsaw puzzle designed by nature. Our tailored 2026 voyages allow you access to this colour-soaked wilderness in ways that will imprint on your memory forever. Journeys depart from Broome, Darwin or Fremantle and include daily excursions on both land and sea; from viewing the world-renowned Gwion Gwion (Bradshaw) and Wandjina rock art, painted onto wind-worn caves, to the wildlife sanctuaries of Ashmore Reef and Adele Island. Crocodiles, dugongs, wallabies and sea turtles will be your journey companions, and blazing outback sunrises and sunsets will bookend every day.

BROOME TO DARWIN



Begin your 10-day adventure in tropical Broome, the gateway to the Kimberley, known for its shimmering ‘staircase to the moon’ nighttime light phenomenon, as well as its wide, sugar-sand beaches and sparkling waterways. From there, you’ll explore the Buccaneer Archipelago, home to the bewitching ‘disappearing’ Montgomery Reef and the remarkable spectacle of the Horizontal Falls. A day spent at the ruggedly elegant El Questro resort at Wyndham is an unforgettable experience, exclusively available to Silversea guests. Your voyage ends in Darwin, the heart of the Top End, with its lively restaurants and waterfront entertainment.

DARWIN TO DARWIN



This 10-day itinerary begins and ends in the busy waterfront town of Darwin, before criss-crossing the ocean between mainland rivers and eucalypt forests and far-flung reefs, found far out to sea. Highlights of the journey include a visit to the flourishing, protected birdlife of Ashmore Reef, exploring the ancient rock art of Vansittart Bay and Swift Bay, or cruising the shorelines of Hunter River and King George River. Adele Island is the place to spot beady-eyed crocodiles, scanning the mudflats for their next meal, or graceful sea turtles gliding through the shallows.



VANSITTART BAY (JAR ISLAND), THE KIMBERLEY

DARWIN TO FREMANTLE



A fully-immersive journey for the truly intrepid, this 17-day voyage begins in the energetic town of Darwin - famous for its lively markets and bustling waterfront dining scene. In addition to the cultural and wildlife explorations of Vansittart Bay, Hunter and King George Rivers and the other embarkations available on the more compact itineraries, this trip adds visits to the 42 islands of the Dampier Peninsula, famous for its lush coral reefs and unique terrestrial wildlife, such as its colonies of Rothschild's Rock Wallabies. Wyndham is also included as a stop, for Ord River cruises and visits to the rugged outback cattle station, El Questro, to experience its red-earthed charm and country hospitality. You'll also explore North Muiron Island, one of the most spectacular diving and snorkelling locations in the world, where an underwater universe of rays and tropical fish awaits. The Abrolhos Islands are another highlight, home to thousands of Australian sea lions, and the world's only colony of Australian Lesser Noddies. Conclude your adventure in historic Fremantle, famous for its bohemian vibe and maritime heritage.
